The recipient must be accepted or enrolled in an accredited academic or technical program. Documentation from the institution must be provided to receive the scholarship. The scholarship will be awarded directly to the student.

Please read the following brief biography about Mary H. Soderberg.

Mary Holton Soderberg was the matriarch of four generations of Soderbergs in the church congregation. She was a graduate of Mount Holyoke College, where she was elected to phi beta kappa and was a proud booster of her alma mater. Mary married Robert (Bob) Soderberg immediately after her graduation and lived and worked in Massachusetts and St. Louis before returning to Mary's roots in Skaneateles in 1968. Mary was an active member of The First Presbyterian Church from the time she joined the church in 1968 until her death in March, 2011. She is remembered by those who knew her well for her great sense of humor, her gift of friendship, her capacity to love, her intelligence, her eloquence, and her understated grace. As a member of the Skaneateles Presbyterian Women's Club, Mary served as treasurer for several years. She provided Bible study for the Ladies' Circles and on request wrote special graces, personalized award presentations, penned words for hymns, and gave a Mother's Day sermon. Mary's love for words and great ability to write in addition to a writer's aplomb for listening and fact seeking allowed her to make each prayer, award or tribute unique and fitting for the occasion. Mary was always proud of her family, past and present, and was intimately involved--and head cheerleader--in their activities and endeavors. She enjoyed meeting new people; traveling, especially to Switzerland and Scandinavia; reading; swimming and cooking. Most of all she was a loving wife, mother, grandmother, great-grandmother and friend to many. Dr. Maya Angelou once said that "I've learned that people will forget what you said, people will forget what you did, but people will never forget how you made them feel." Had Dr. Angelou ever met Mary, she might well have been the embodiment of this discourse.
